## **SBWIB Becomes the First Workforce Board in the U.S. to Register Non-Traditional Apprenticeship Program Nationally**



**The SBWIB has made history** by becoming the **FIRST WORKFORCE BOARD** in the nation to register their non-traditional apprenticeship programs for national use. This milestone will allow SBWIB to support companies with apprenticeship programs that are scalable and transferable across all 50 states, helping businesses expand their skilled labor pool wherever they operate.

### South Bay Workforce Investment Board Becomes First in Nation to Secure National Apprenticeship Standard

The Department of Labor's Employment and Training Administration announced that South Bay Workforce Investment Board (WB) is now the first WB to have a national apprenticeship standard approved, marking a significant milestone in workforce development.

"First workforce board in the country to have a national program," beamed South Bay Workforce Investment Board Director of Business Services & Apprenticeship Chris Cagle in an emailed statement.

This approval highlights the growing role of WBs in connecting employers, apprentices, and training programs to meet local labor demands. With this national standard, the West Coast WB is poised to enhance apprenticeship opportunities in key industries, ensuring that workers gain valuable skills and credentials recognized across the country.



WBs are established under the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act and are local boards tasked with overseeing workforce development initiatives in their regions. The boards function by identifying gaps in employment, partnering with local businesses, and creating programs to train workers in high-demand fields.

## SBWIB Awarded \$1 Million Grant to Expand Apprenticeship Programs for Disadvantaged Youth

The South Bay Workforce Investment Board (SBWIB) has been awarded a \$1 million California Opportunity Youth Apprenticeship (COYA) Grant by the California Department of Industrial Relations and its Division of Apprenticeship Standards. The funding will

South Bay Workforce Investment Board Awarded \$1 Million Grant to Expand Apprenticeship Programs for Disadvantaged Youth

Hawthorne, CA. The South Bay Workforce Investment Board (SBWIB) has been awarded a \$1 million California Opportunity Youth Apprenticeship (COYA) Grant by the California Department of Industrial Relations and its Division of Apprenticeship Standards. The funding will be used to create and expand apprenticeship programs for disadvantaged youth across the region and surrounding areas.

The two-year project will leverage new and existing community partnerships to provide training and employment opportunities for targeted youth populations, including individuals from foster care, justice-involved youth, youth parents, individuals with disabilities, and those from low-income communities. The program aims to enroll 100 individuals, offering comprehensive support such as training, mentoring, career guidance, and placement into apprenticeship programs leading to employment.

Participants will have the opportunity to enter apprenticeship programs across five key sectors: advanced manufacturing (aerospace and biosciences), IT, healthcare, arts, media and entertainment, and energy. The goal is to help these young individuals gain the skills and experience needed to build sustainable careers in high-demand industries.

"This grant award highlights our long-standing success in providing disadvantaged youth access to career pathways through apprenticeships, helping them secure high-paying careers," said SBWIB Executive Director Jan Vogel.

SBWIB's apprenticeship programs are employer-driven, designed to upskill current employees while developing the future workforce pipeline. For over 41 years, SBWIB has offered no cost services to residents and businesses across the South Bay region through its four One-Stop Business and Career Centers in Inglewood, Carson, Torrance, and Gardena. Youth aged 16-24 can also access specialized services through the Inglewood and Hawthorne Teen Centers.

The California Youth Apprenticeship Committee (CYAC) was convened as called for by SB 191 to develop recommendations for the Division of Apprenticeship Standards (DAS) on how to implement youth apprenticeships for in-school and out-of-school youth in California.

The South Bay Workforce Investment Board, Chris Cagle, served on the CYAC committee assisting with this work.

The resulting report provides a roadmap that aligns systems, establish education connected youth apprenticeship pathways, illustrates on ramps and off ramps to career

progression, identifies resources and support for quality paid work-based learning opportunities available for youth, and connects those youth to better educational outcomes and improved economic opportunity. Recognizing employers are at the heart of an apprenticeship, this report aims to provide guidance to support business and industry leaders in establishing apprenticeships for the youth in California.

The training initiatives were funded by the State of California Employment Training Panel (ETP) and administered by SBWIB.

In recognition of the program's positive outcomes, ETP has awarded SBWIB an additional \$726,810 to extend the project for another two years. 


